Subj: New OEM Price Guideline for Systems Products

Adjustments to OEM pricing marked by the attached price guideline revision go beyond meeting the demands of recent changes in the PC marketplace. Our goal to put DOS and Windows in addition to premium extensions for Multimedia and Pen computing "everywhere" will be well served. Further, the new pricing presents you with potent tools to out maneuver and beat the competition. As you use the new price guideline and develop ideas and questions about pricing, please feel free to direct any questions or comments you may have to me (tomge).

Also available will be a junior size price guideline which will be available upon request. If you use the junior size time systems or daytimer then you may want to request a junior copy of the price guideline from launab.

Briefly, pricing adjustments are summarized as follows:

Operating System Products:

- o CPU categories have been reshaped into Entry, Mid- and High-range segments.
- o Pricing for both Windows and DOS has been "leveled" whereby the spread between the highest and lowest royalties has been narrowed.
- o Multimedia and Pen extensions for Windows are now offered as an incremental or "premium" royalty in addition to the Windows royalty.
- o The OEM is offered incentives and adders that permit tailoring of licenses to fit the OEM's needs. Incentives are offered for: extending licenses to 3-years, pre-installation of software on hard disks, and per-processor licenses.
- o OS/2 can now be advantageously licensed by an OEM in combination with DOS and Windows.
- o DOS 5.0 is offered under special circumstances for named development countries.

Networking:

- o TCP/IP pricing is made available.
- o Asynchronous Dial-in services pricing is made available.
- o MAC Connectivity pricing is made available.
- o LAN Manager for Unix pricing is expanded to new system types.

Printer:

- o TrueImage PDL royalty reduction.

Mouse:

- o New drivers, part numbers and changes. Changes to International mouse pricing has been proposed but will not appear in this revision.

Applications:

- o Applications products that appeared in past releases this price guideline will be found in the soon to be released "Applications Products Price Guideline". This is slated for release within Q1 of this fiscal year, 1992.

EXAMPLE 1:

The Annual Commitment Level & Per-System Royalty Determination

In this example, the OEM licenses DOS and Windows on a per-processor basis for all systems. The OEM's "Annual Commitment Level" is determined by aggregating the OEM's total PC shipments. The OEM ships 300K units per year: 50K 80286's, 150K 80386SX's, 50K 80386DX and 50K 80486SX's. Applicable DOS and Windows royalty rates, from the 250K column of Tables A1, A2 and A3, would be:

Applying Royalty Incentives & Adders

This OEM reserves the lowest price since he committed to a per-processor agreement. Per-processor licenses enjoy a \$1.00 royalty reduction (from Table A4). Further, the OEM has elected to license for a 3-year period, and to pre-install the software on a hard disk drive; subtract another \$1.00 from DOS and Windows royalties, and subtract \$2.00 from the Windows royalty. Adjustments to the royalties would look like:

In addition to the incentives shown an "adder" has been included in the pricing to discourage non-standard, 1-year licenses. In the same way incentives are subtracted from the royalty, add \$1.00 to the royalty for 1-year licenses. International versions are uplifted at flat dollar rates shown in Table A4 (except for Arabic DOS, see * above). Add these flat rates to the royalties from tables A1, A2 and A3.

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EXAMPLE 2:The Annual Commitment Level & Per-System Royalty Determination

In this example, the OEM will license DOS per-processor and Windows per-system. Non-Windows machines will have the DOS shell, while the Windows machines do not. Once again, the OEM is shipping 50K 80286's, 150K 80386SX's, 50K 80386DX and 50K 80486SX's for a total PC shipment volume of 300K. Of these 300K, 100K will be shipped with Windows, therefore their DOS royalties will be found in the 250K columns, while the Windows royalties will be found in the 100K columns of Tables A1, A2 and A3. The OEM will ship 200K units with the DOS shell (300K - 100K).

Applying Royalty Incentives & Adders

The DOS royalty should be reduced by \$1.00 since the OEM is licensing the product on a per-processor basis. Once again, the OEM has elected to license for a 3-year period, and to pre-install the software on a hard disk drive; subtract another \$1.00 from DOS and Windows royalties, and subtract \$2.00 from the Windows royalty.

Adjustments to the royalties would look like:

The OEM in Example 2 has at the last minute decided to license Multimedia extensions for Windows 3.0. They plan to ship half of their 100K Windows machines with the Multimedia functionality and therefore license the product at the royalty rate located in the 50K column of Table A5.

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MS-DOS 5.0 for Named Development Countries

Named development countries are Peoples Republic of China and the Soviet Union only. Licensing is for local manufacturers in their country of origin for local language versions of the product only, and for distribution in that country only and not for export. Licenses are for 1-year with 1-year extensions as mutually agreeable to MS & OEM. All other terms and conditions are standard and non-negotiable. Licenses are for a minimum commitment of 5,000 units.

Notes for "A" and "B" Tables

- Note 1: Multimedia and Pen from Table A5 are premium extensions to the DOS and Windows platform, and are priced in A5 as a premium to be added to the Windows base royalty. OEM's that wish to license products from A5 without already licensing Windows from A1, A2 and/or A3 or to license Multimedia for Windows for non-PC systems should be quoted from Table B1 following.
- Note 2: The rommable version of MS-DOS 5 is included with the standard MS-DOS 5 license. It is the OEM's choice whether to ship a ROM-executable or RAM-executable version.
- Note 3: The OAK for Windows 3.0 contains version 7.04 of the Microsoft mouse driver. In the case where an OEM ships a non-Microsoft mouse and ships the Microsoft mouse driver v 7.04 with Windows there is an additional \$5.00 added to the Windows royalty.
- Note 4: Prices for OS/2 User's Guide \$16.00, part number 13738. This is a 6 in by 8 in 3 hole punch document inserts (binders not included).
- Note 5: The OEM must be qualified to support Windows directly in every country where it is shipped.
- Note 6: For MS-DOS/V Kanji drivers, there is a \$2.00 uplift charge in addition to the MS-DOS 5.0 royalty and \$2.00 localization fee for DOS. OEM deliverables are in object code format.
- Note 7: Upgrade kits contain both an audio card and CD-ROM drive. These licensed products may be distributed by OEM as finished goods. The license restricts the OEM from sub-licensing the products for inclusion in PC's for parties other than end-users. CD-ROM drive must meet performance requirements of MPC specification. Contact Tomge or Pamela to quote these products.

Note 5: OS/2 is not included with LAN Manager 2.0. The user must license OS/2 separately. LM 2.0 requires OS/2 1.21 or 1.4S at the server and supports client workstations running OS/2 1.1 or 1.2, and MS-DOS 3.3 or later versions.

Note 6: Royalties for all localized products are 15% higher than US version counterpart shown here.

Note 7: Source licensing is discouraged. Work with VP OEM to develop pricing if necessary.

Note 8: TCP/IP ships in object code form. Refer inquiries of license source code to V.P. of OEM. Utilities included from DOS 4, OS/2, BSD 4.3 socket interface, Netbios, FTP RCP, RSH, Ping, Telnet, VT100 (DOS Only), TTY, BAPY.

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Expanded Marketing Rights for Network Products

For a royalty premium, OEMs may be authorized to distribute the licensed network products below in conjunction with their proprietary value-add software onto hardware their customer may have purchased from another vendor. The idea is to provide a method for OEMs with full-service sales and support organizations to be able to service large corporate customers with Microsoft network products. The value-add software must be of greater value than the Microsoft software sold along with it. Again, this is only available to the OEM's direct sales forces and not to down-stream distribution such as VARs and Distributors. Any such deal needs to be discussed with VP OEM prior to the offering.

Windows Printer Driver Development & Certification Program

The Windows Printer Drivers Development and Certification Program is designed to assist the printer manufacturer in assuring their Windows Printer drivers are of the highest possible quality and with the distribution of their drivers. Only with certification will Microsoft make its many distribution vehicles (i.e. with Windows, OnLine, Electronic Bulletin Boards, etc.) available to deliver the driver to end users.

Windows Printer Drivers Development: A printer OEM which does not offer a printer compatible with any of the standard printer drivers supplied in Microsoft Windows and those OEMs who do not have the expertise to write their own Windows printer drivers may contract with Microsoft's Printer Business Unit (PBU) or IPG Ireland to have one developed.

Certification Program: The PBU also offers a certification program for Windows printer drivers that were not written by Microsoft. The charges are different between drivers which are written under the Windows Mini-Driver Tools and those which aren't. Contact PBU marketing representative if your OEMs are interested in the above services.
