The Windows graphical environment version 3.0 is currently available in Dutch, Finnish, French, German, Italian, Kanji, Korean, Norwegian, Portuguese, Spanish and Swedish. Future releases of Microsoft Windows are scheduled for localization in Arabic, Bahasa Indonesian, Bahasa Malaysian, Czech, Hebrew, Hungarian, Russian, Thai and Turkish.

"Seeing so many localized versions of Microsoft Windows in every corner of the globe is thrilling," said Joachim Kempin, [title]. "It's clear that Windows is becoming the

Chinese Version Expected to Reach Large Market

The Chinese version of Windows was developed primarily by Microsoft's Far East product development group, in cooperation with key more local contractors. It will be introduced to interested users through a series of seminars sponsored by the Microsoft Taiwan subsidiary, beginning in August and continuing later this year.

"Chinese is the thirteenth localized version of Windows 3.0, and it is especially important because of the highly graphical nature of the Chinese language," said Kempin. "It allows the Far East to participate in the worldwide growth of Windows applications and the ease of use and interoperability they bring "

"The availability of Chinese Windows 3.0 is a breakthrough for computing in Taiwan," said Shaw Gang Yang, general manager of Far East development at Microsoft. "We expect more people in Taiwan will use personal computers than ever before because of the ease of use Windows 3.0 brings to computing. Windows 3.0 should bring major growth to the PC market here in Taiwan, which has an installed base of one million PCs to date."

Windows In Europe

Microsoft Windows has shipped more than one million retail copies in Europe during the last 12 months. In several European countries, Windows has collected noteworthy achievements. In the United Kingdom, this year's U.K. Windows Chinese Version of Microsoft Windows
