Paul investigated and found:

Kory reports that if we use any other PS/2 mouse everything is fine. The hardware detection that we do on PS/2's is an INT 15h. When we do this INT 15h, the BIOS returns with the keyboard disabled (it is supposed to disable the mouse) and BH does not equal 0 (which it should if there is a mouse present according to the PS/2 BIOS documentation). So this is a bug in the BIOS resulting from this particular mouse. There *might* be some sort of a work around, but it is way too risky to change something like that without massive testing.

Do you want us to investigate further so we can point our finger at the culprit more specifically (may be quite a bit of work to trace through the BIOS call and check differences between a Mouse that works and one that doesn't).
