This implies that the focus of the group working on Mirrors may be changed from porting Win Word to making Mirrors a systems product which will be included with PM 2.0. A decision to do the latter without first doing PM Word will be a big setback to the delivery of PM Word. Last I heard PM 2.0 was well over a year away since 1.2 is supposedly slipping a couple of months out >from July.

Mike, I assume you will be supporting the notion of using Win Word as a test bed and getting this done before they focus on making Mirrors part of PM.

Yes, the current push (still in the works) is to make Mirrors a systems product, and ship it as a PM 2.0 feature which would run Windows 3.0 binaries off the shelf. What this means is either 1> we code to binary compatiblity immediately, or 2> we code to the Opus subset immediately, two different things. If we code to binary compatibility immediately, then we won't be courting the PM Opus schedule as closely as we previously anticipated, meaning PM Opus will ship when binary compatibility works and all the entry points Opus calls are complete.

Tomorrow there is a meeting between MikeMap and PaulMa and us to discuss this topic.
